To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:

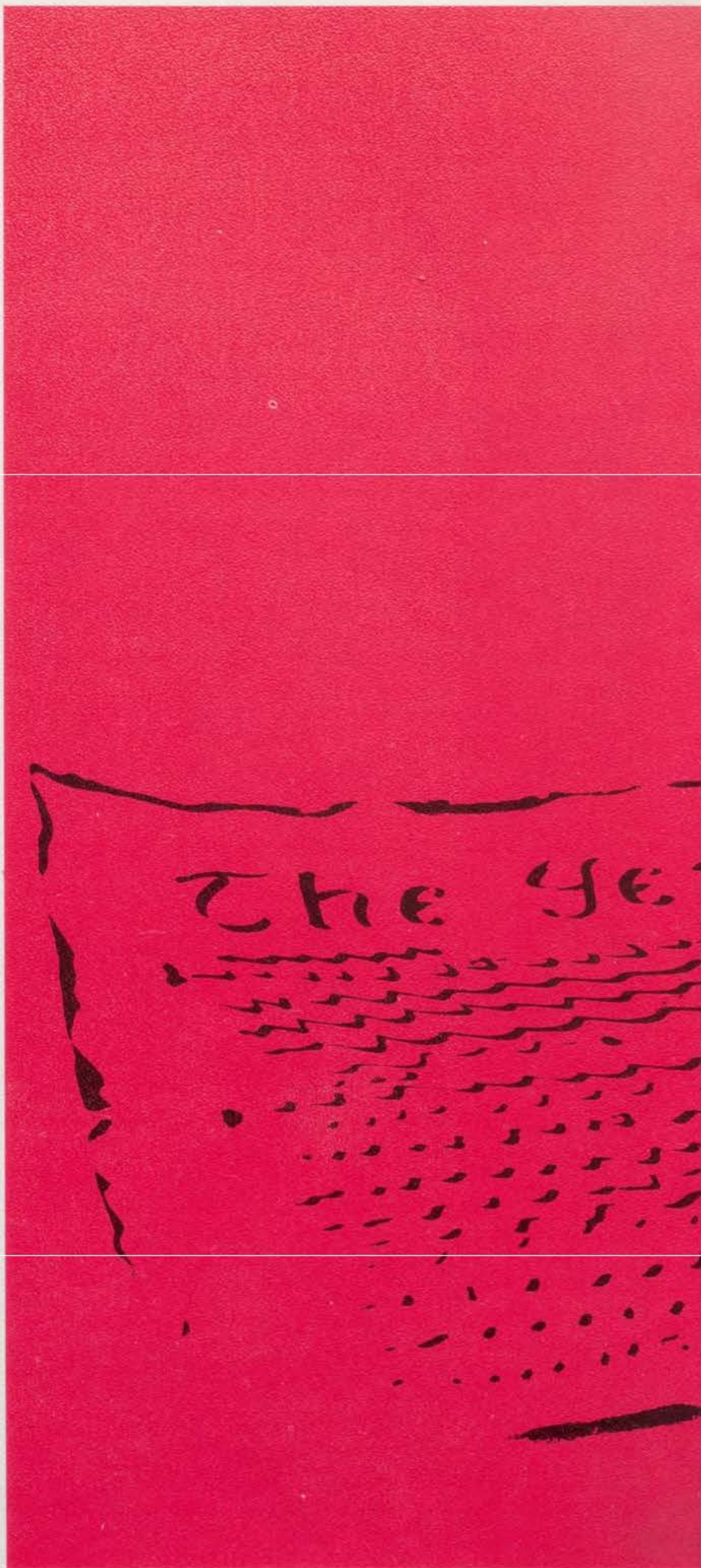

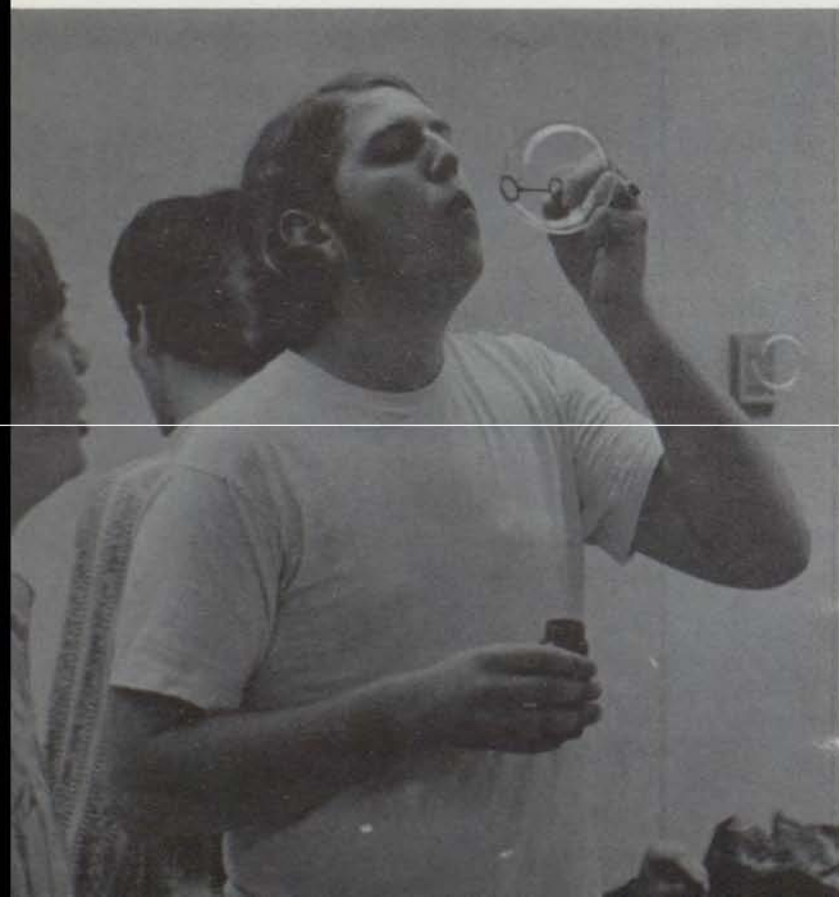
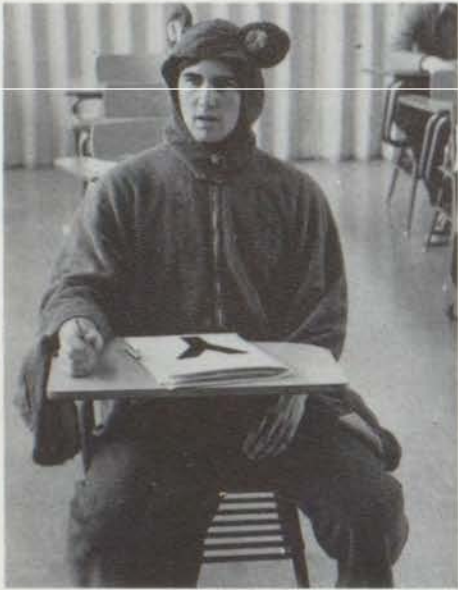




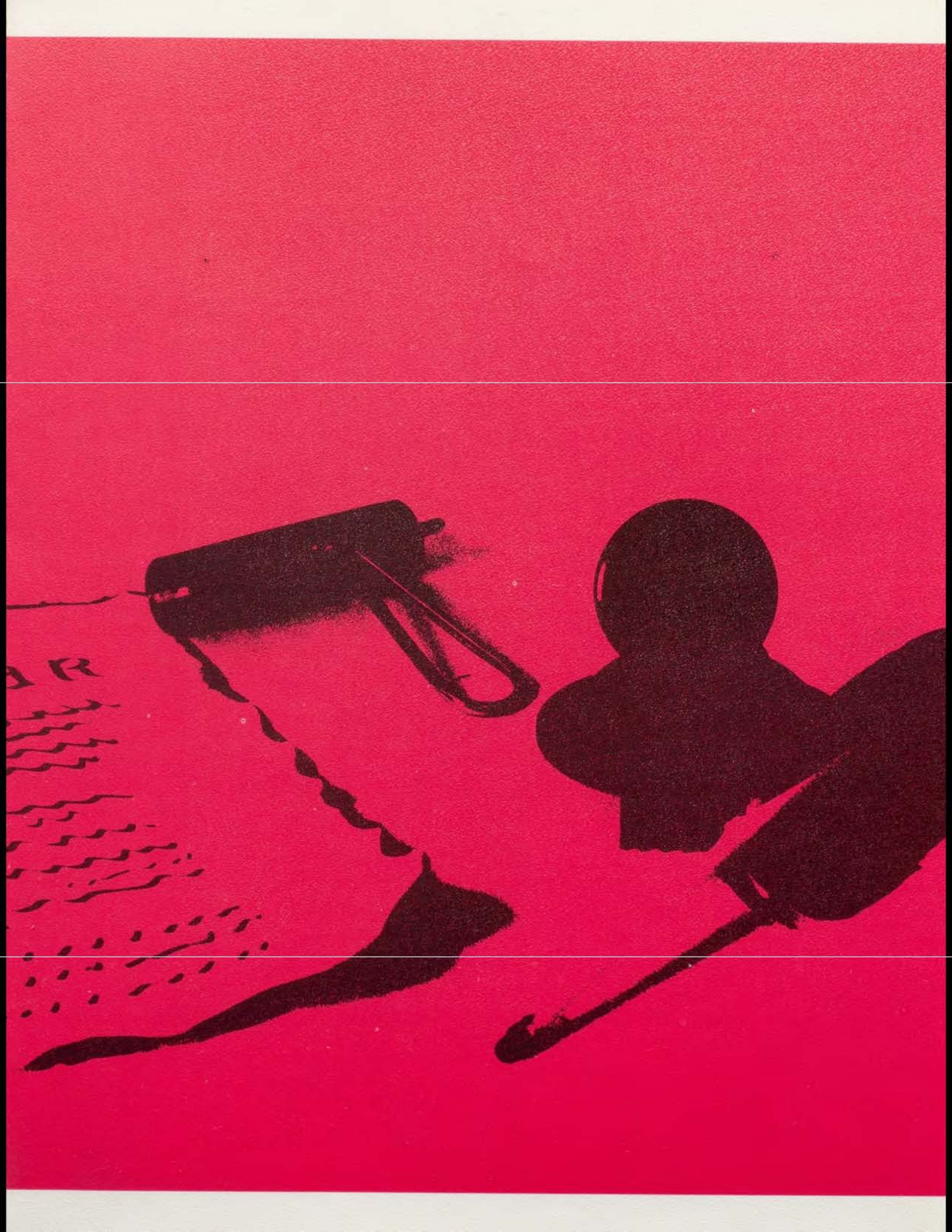
Registration

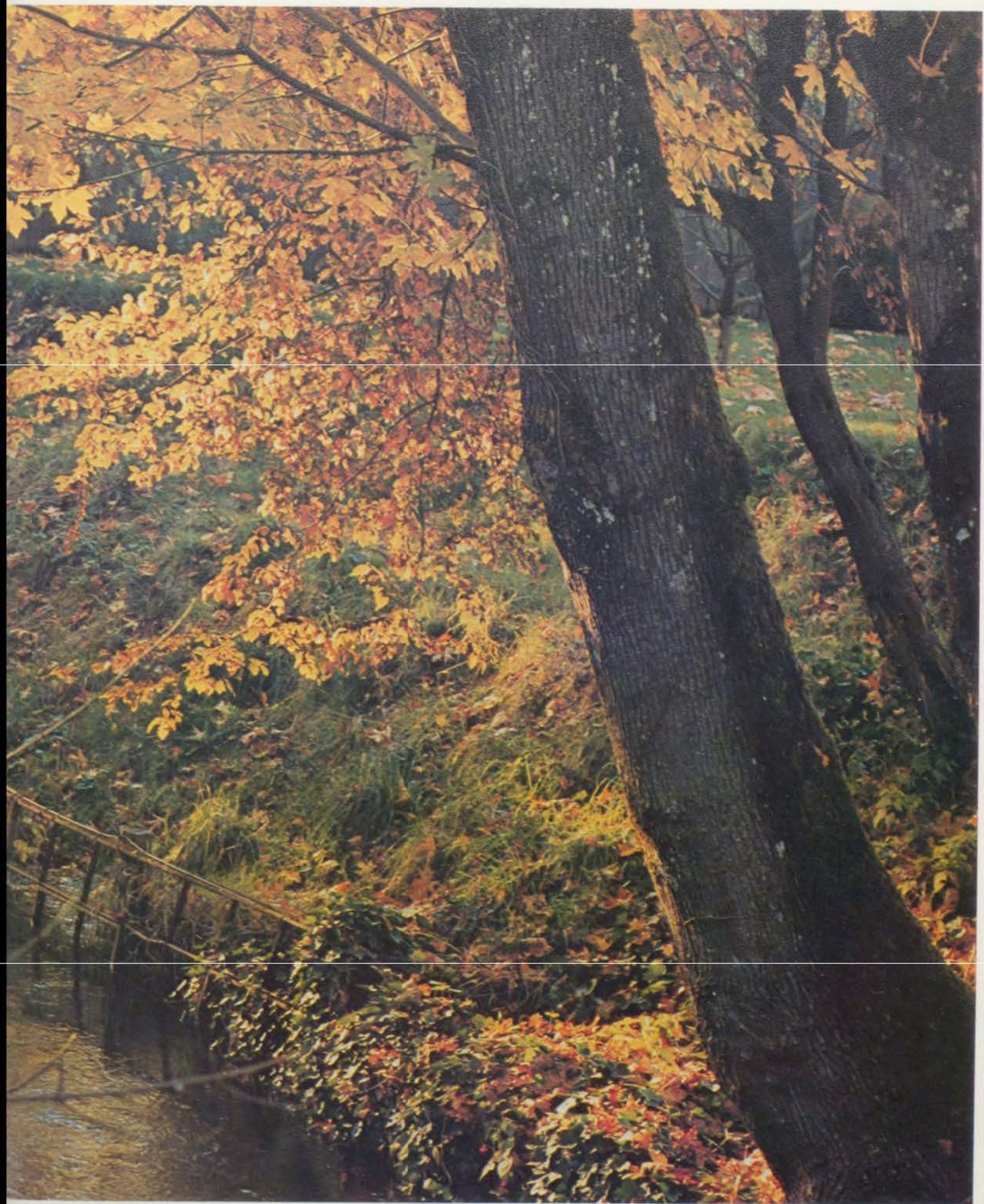

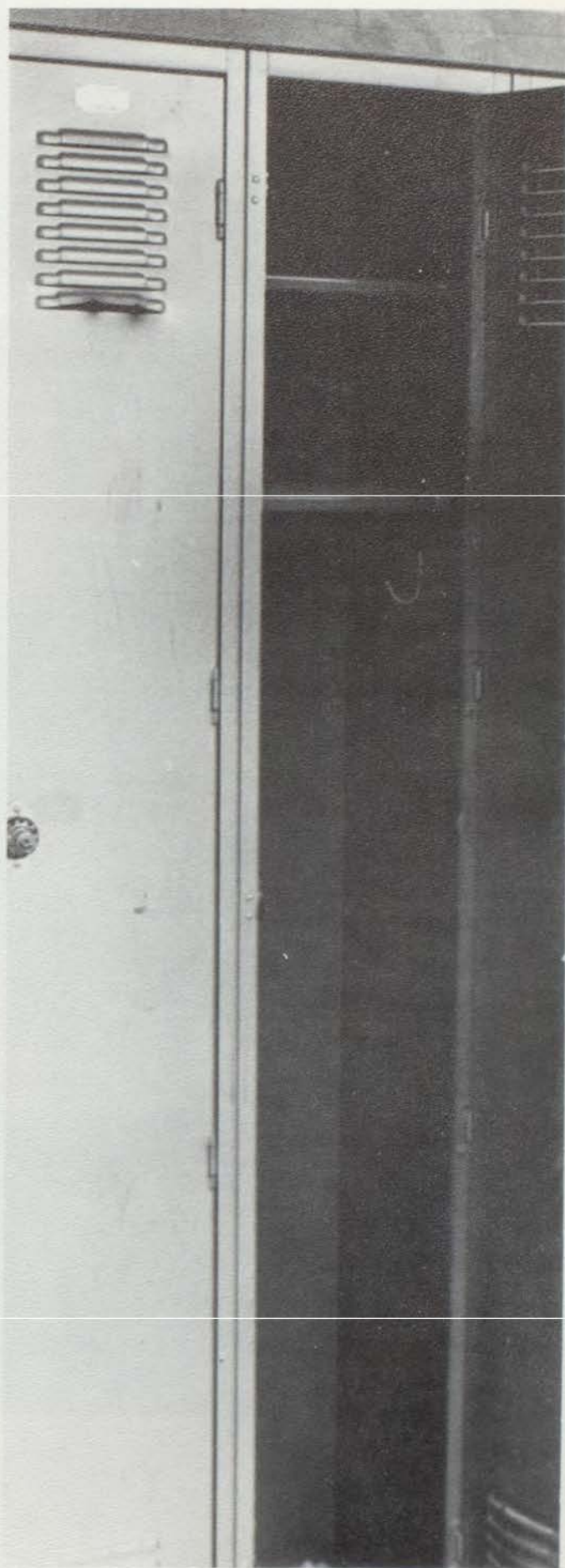
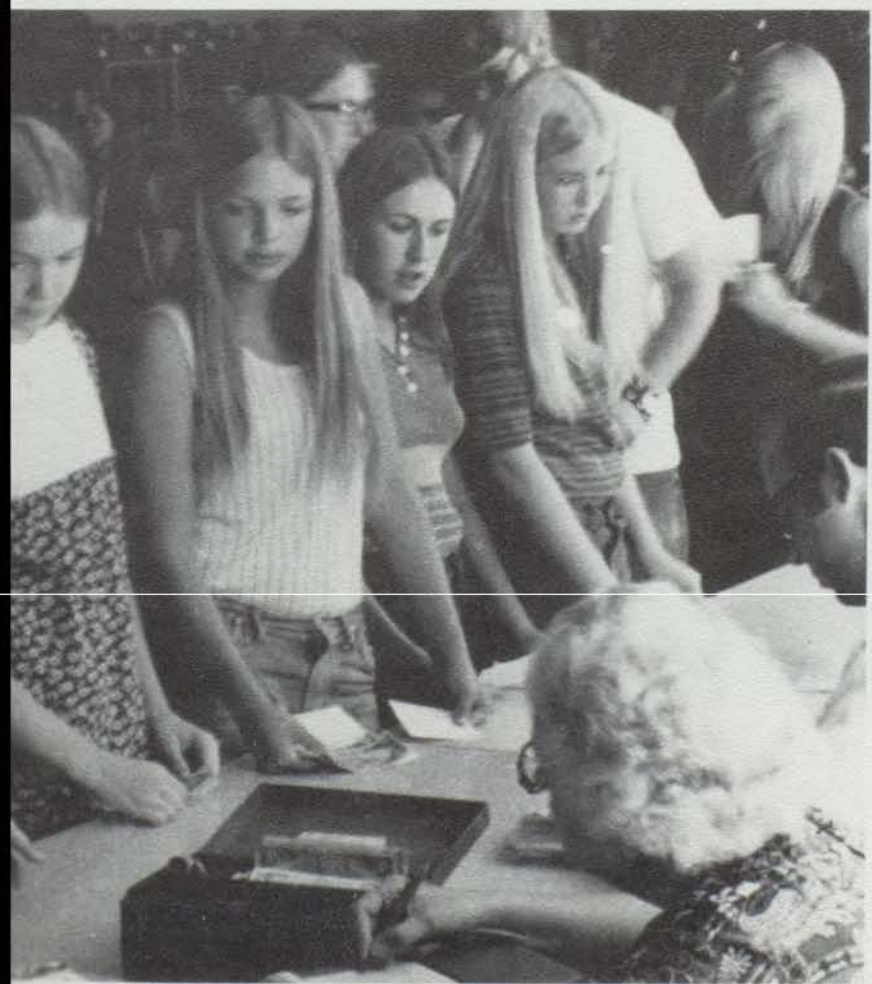


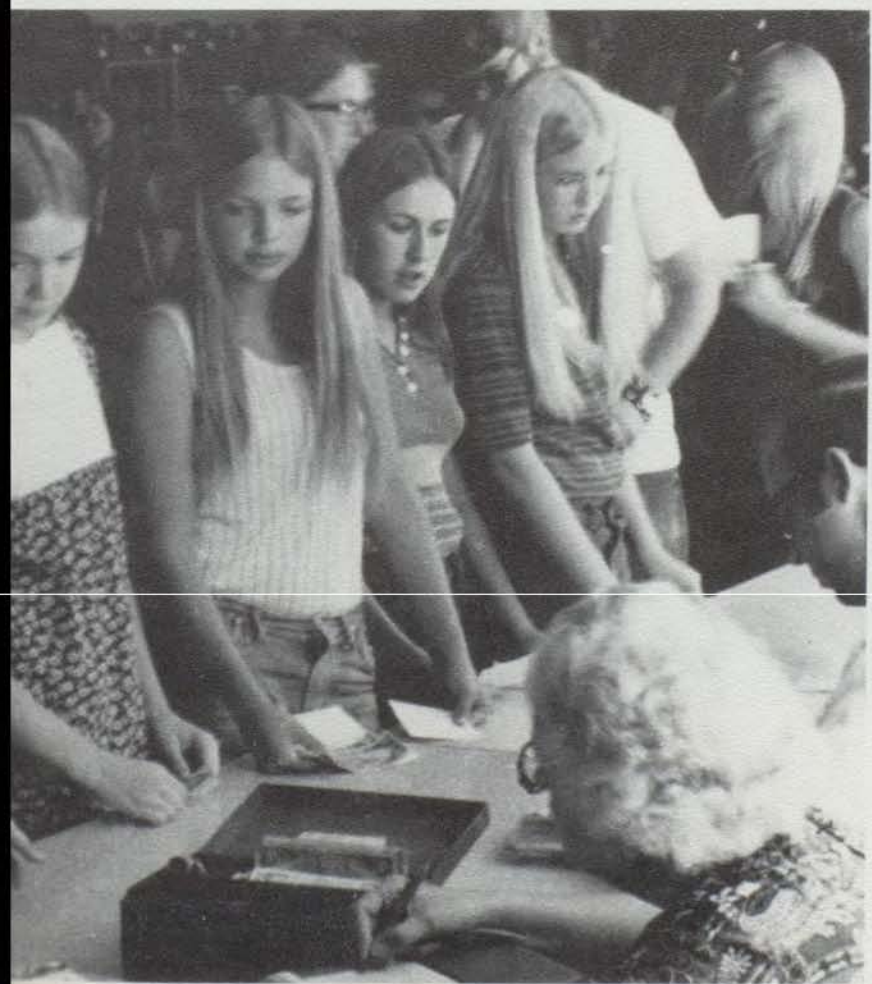












Fall Sports

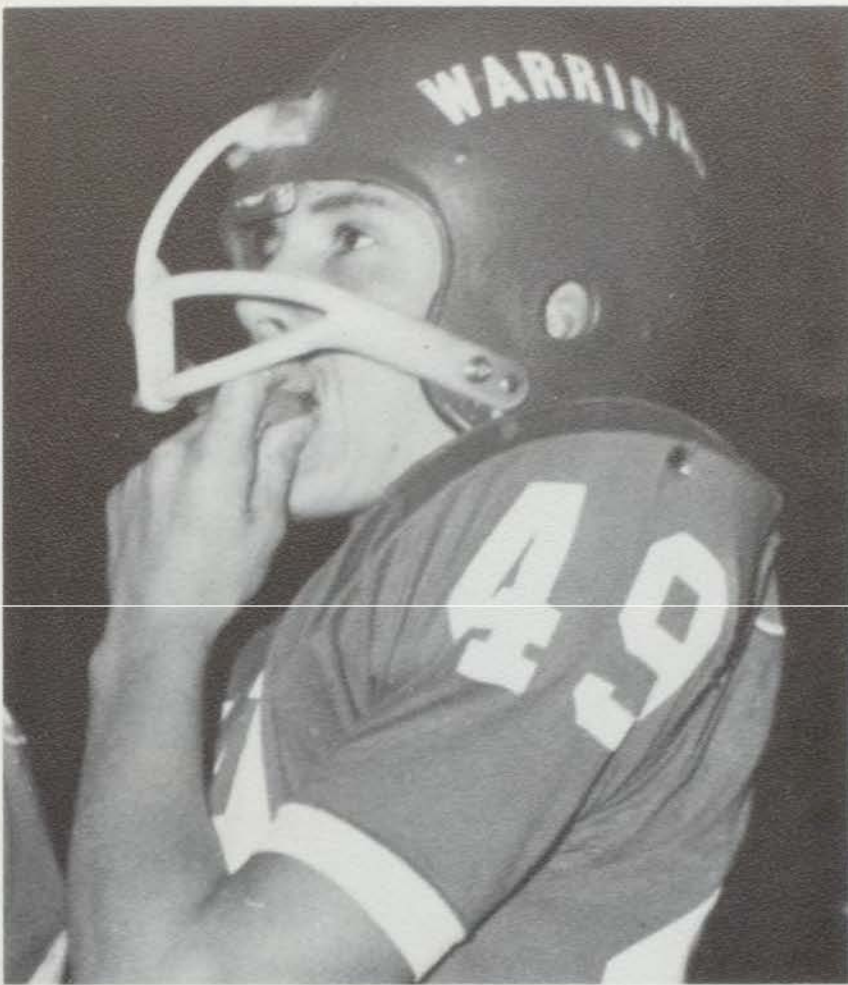

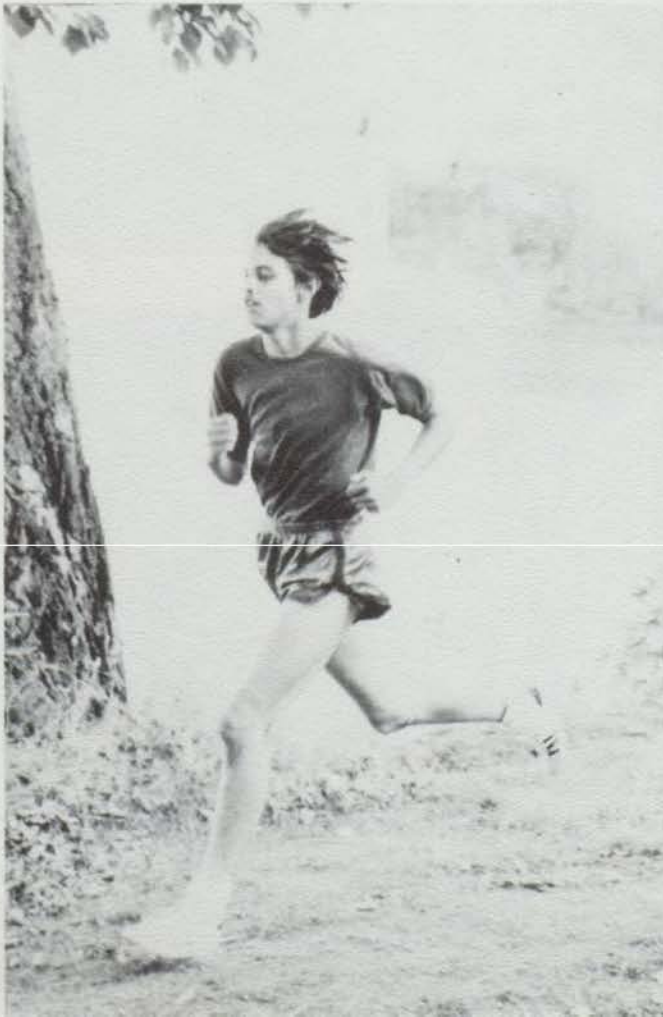
The boys team did not fare so well, racking up a 5-4 win-loss record.

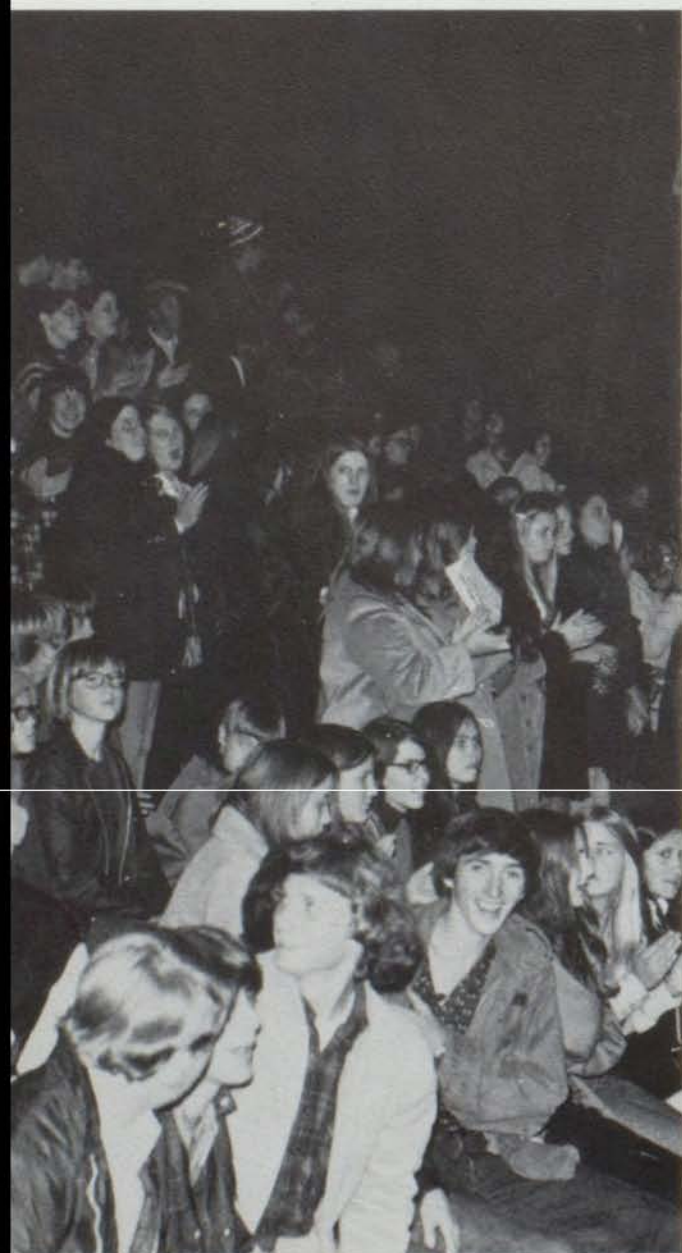

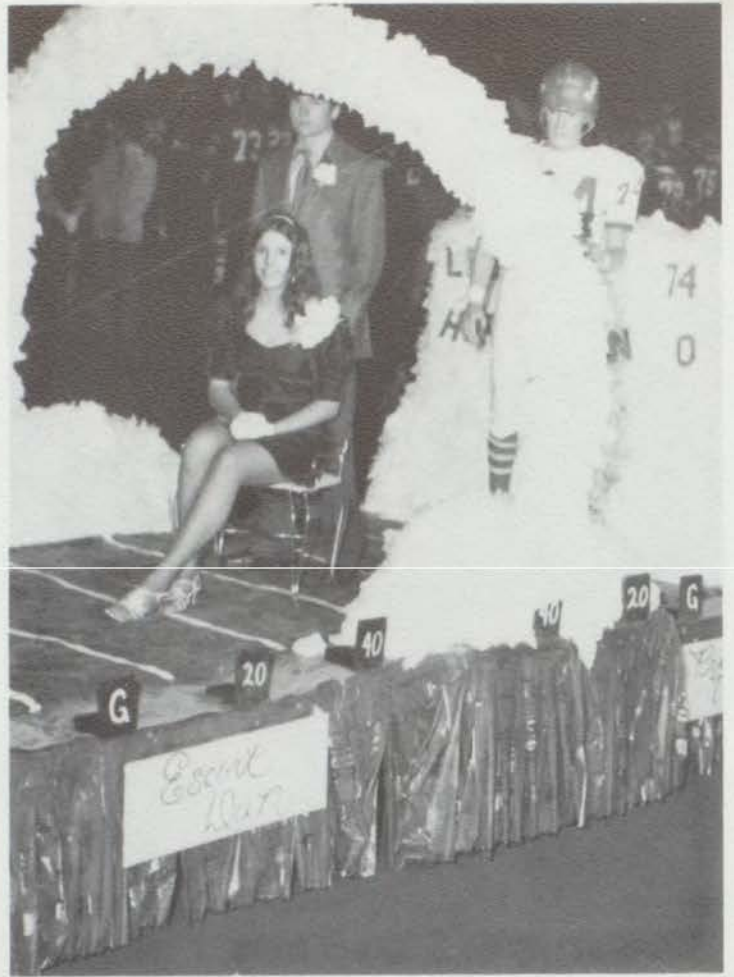
Homecoming 1972

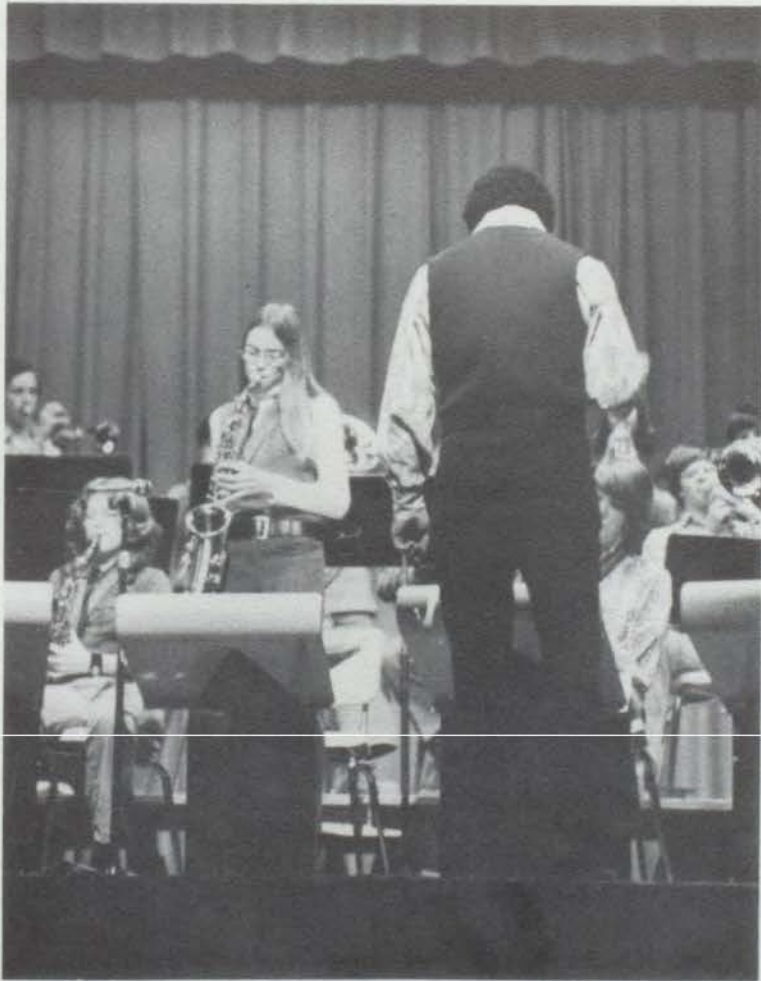

Twirp Week

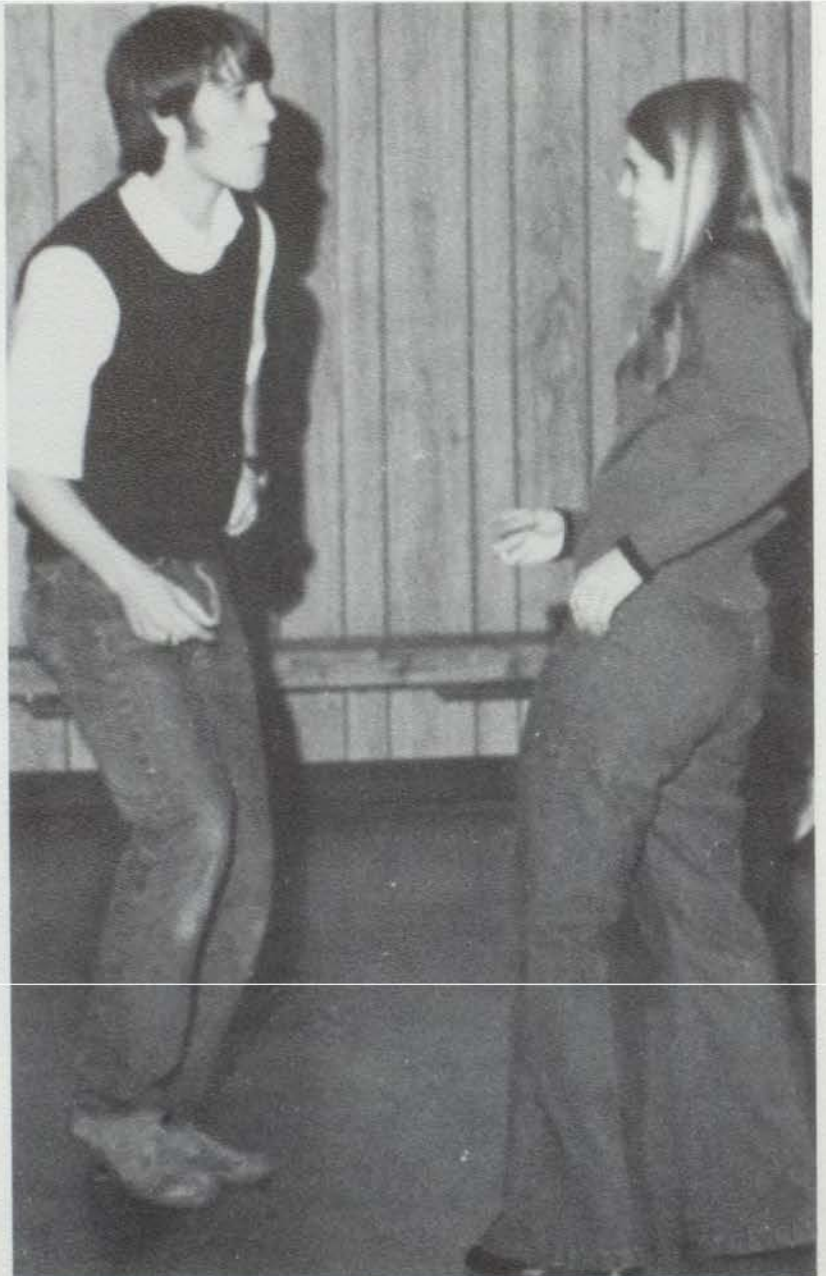

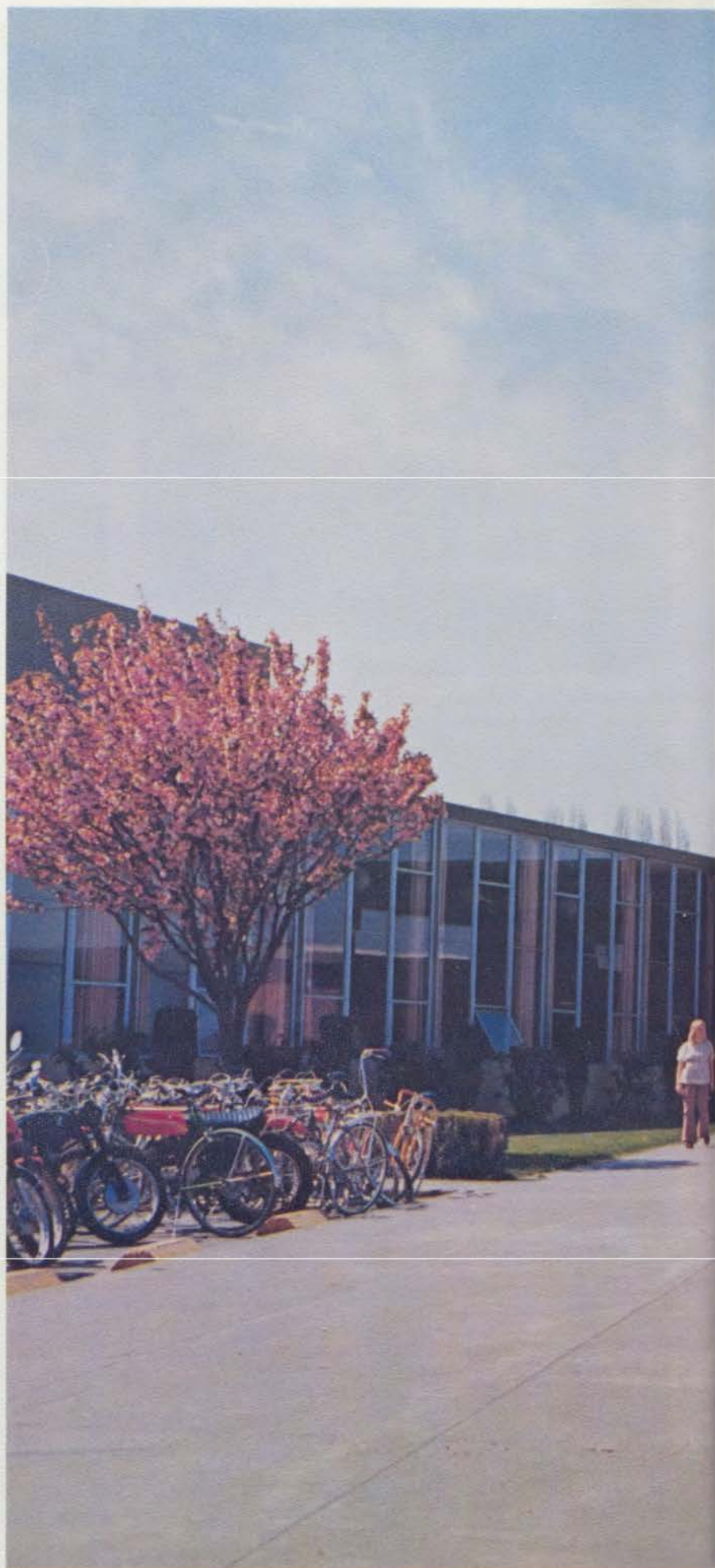
Seasprites

School Board Members are elected by the community to serve a two year term. They give of their time for the betterment of the schools and the community.

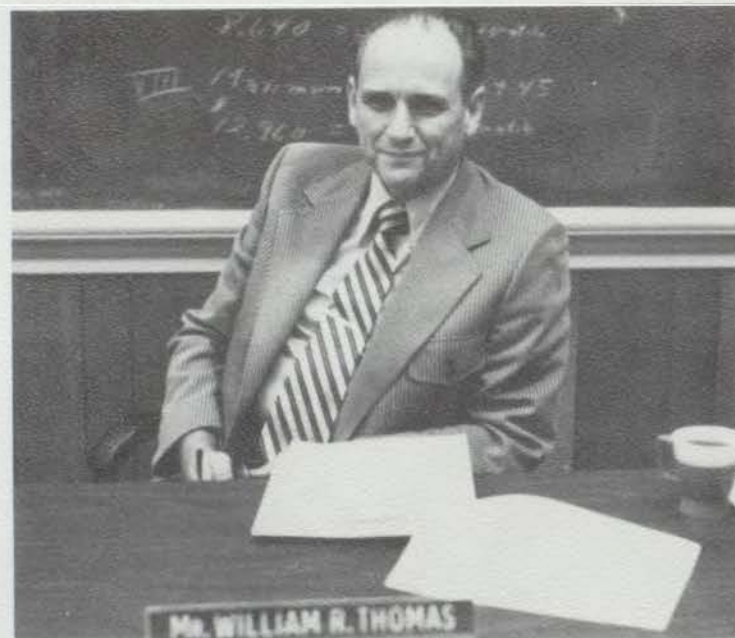

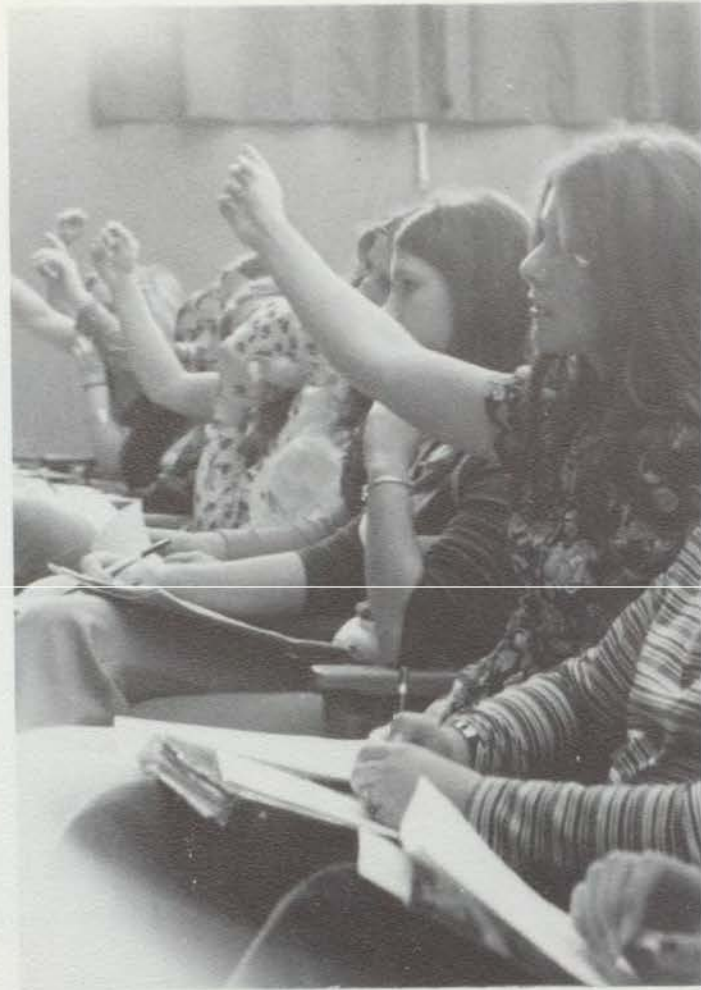

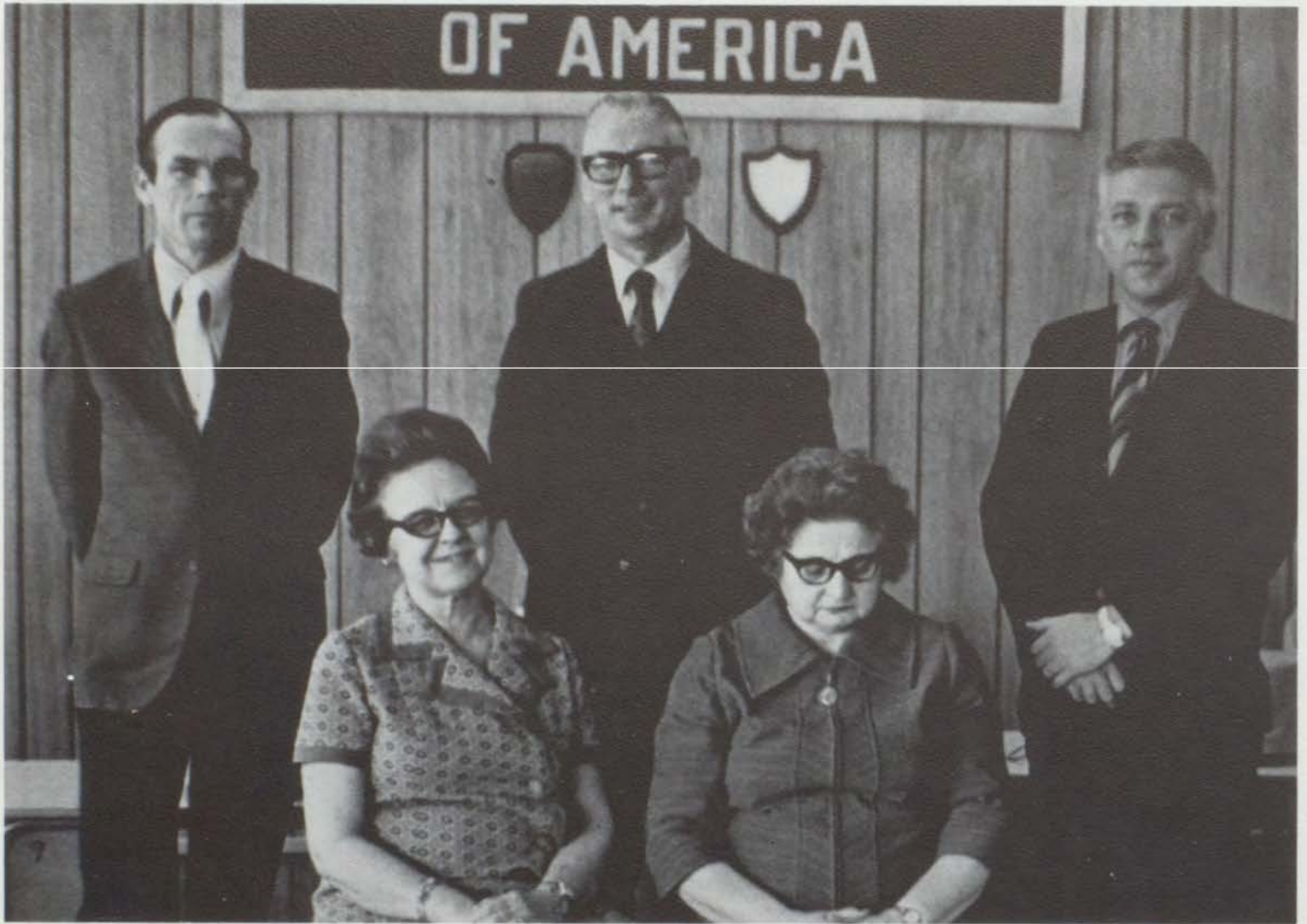

The students have the opportunity to learn how to type, account figures and use the various machines available in the business department.

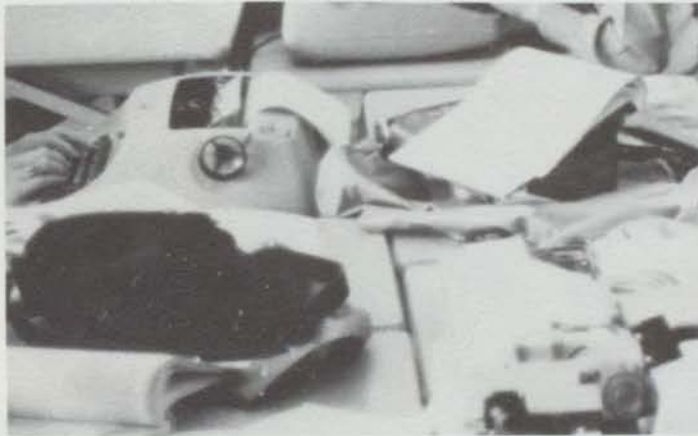
The Sorter machine in the business room is used to help separate the students grades and to alphabetize them.

Foreign Languages offered include French, Spanish, and German. One level of French is offered, two levels of German, and five of Spanish.



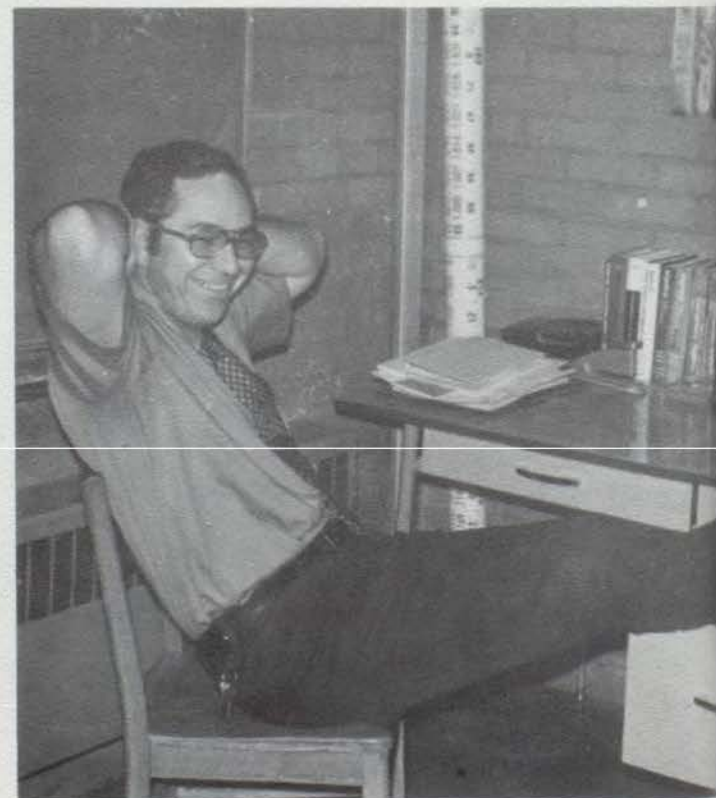
Math

Elective history courses include Contemporary World Problems and Geography Environment.

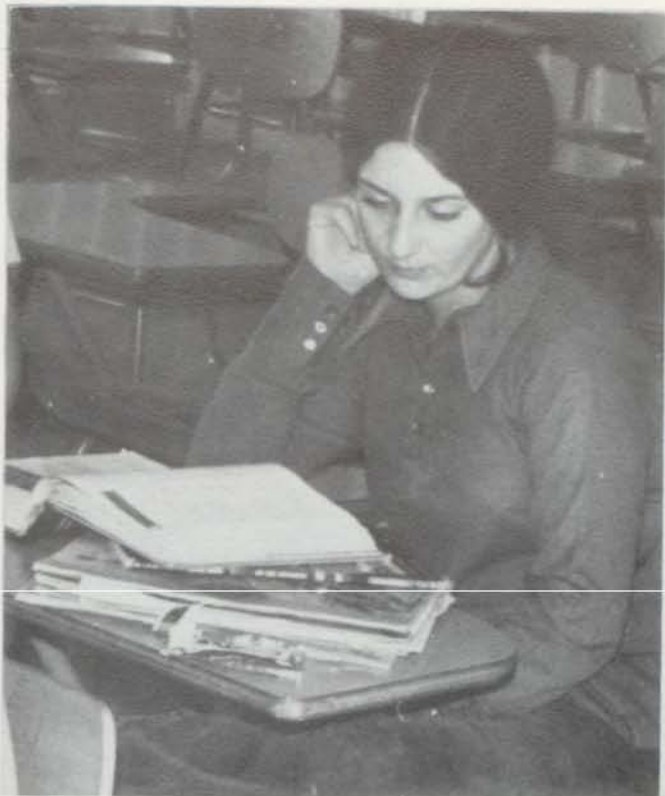

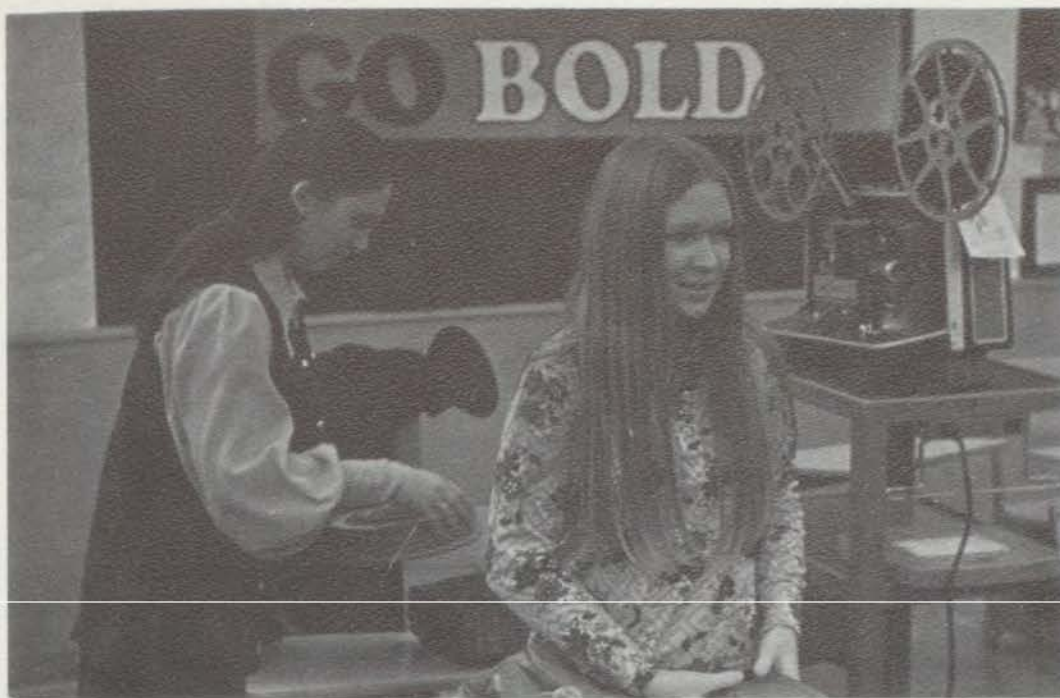


Honor Society

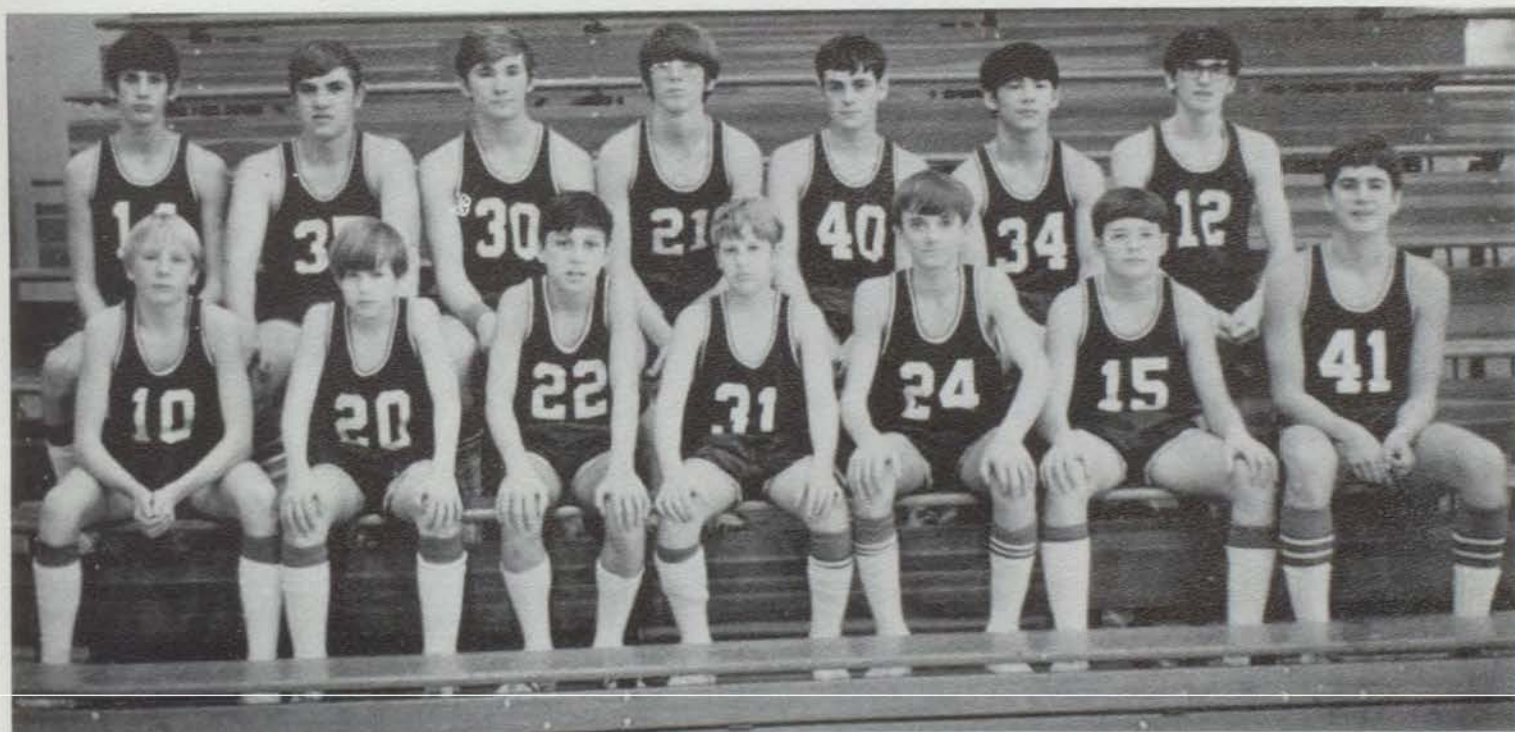
Sophomore Basketball

There will be a new attraction to the varsity baseball field this summer, thanks to Head Coach Bill Croco. Lights are being put in so night games will be possible.

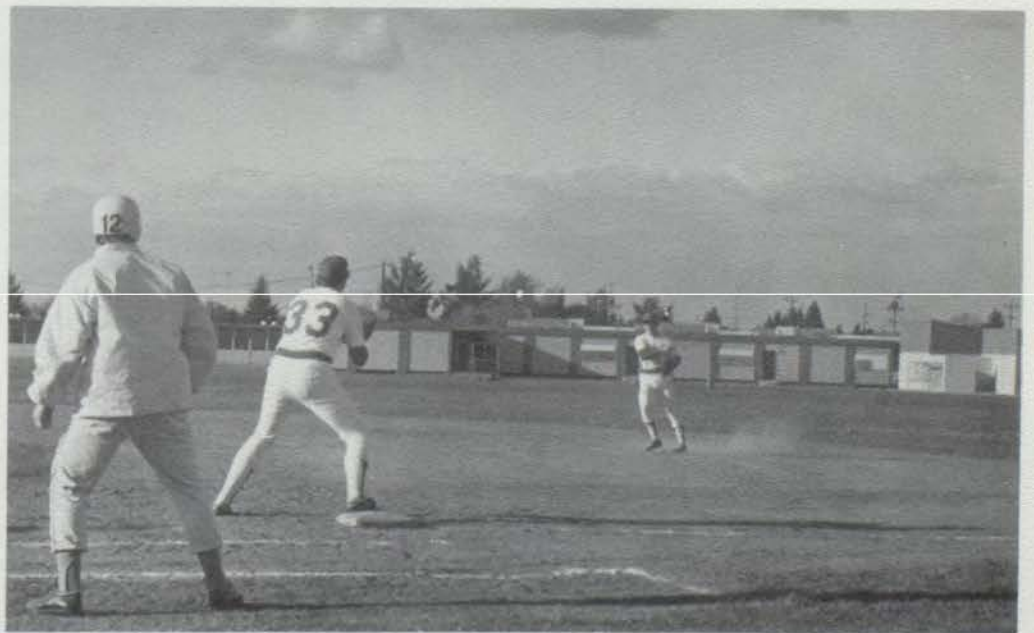
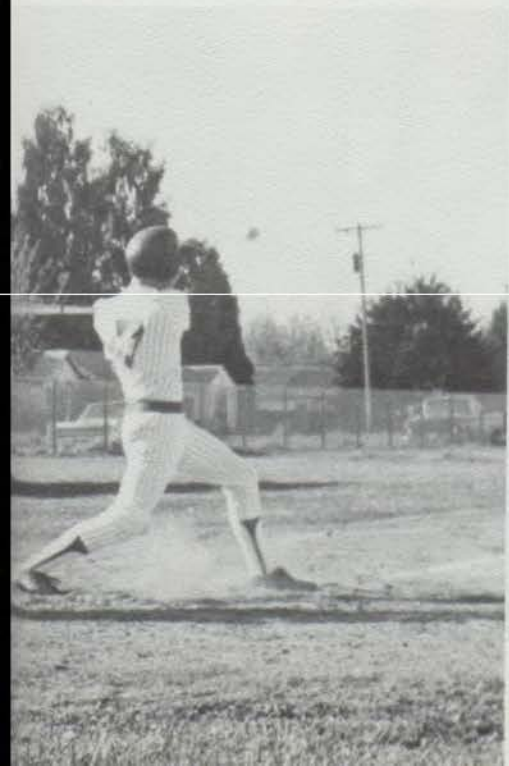
The veteran coach will be dealt a big blow, so to speak, by graduation this year. He will be losing his complete starting nine except for utility man Jack Willems.
