Just because our school lost its mascot doesn't mean we lost our identity. We know who we are and what we stand for. Though we will only be a students here for a short time, we will always be Warriors.

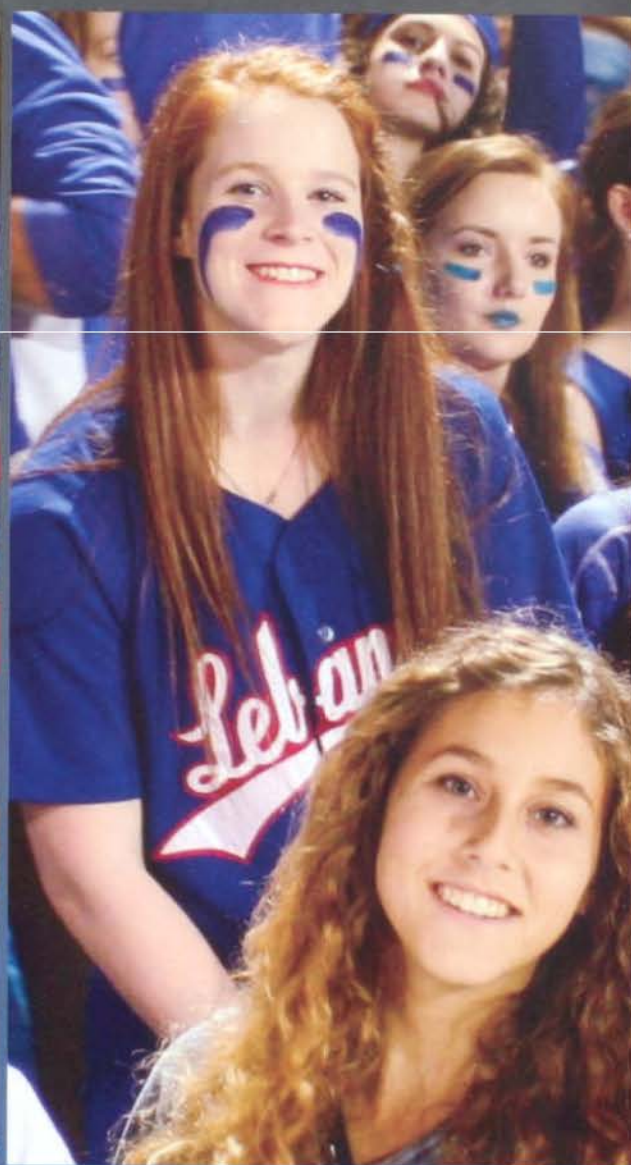

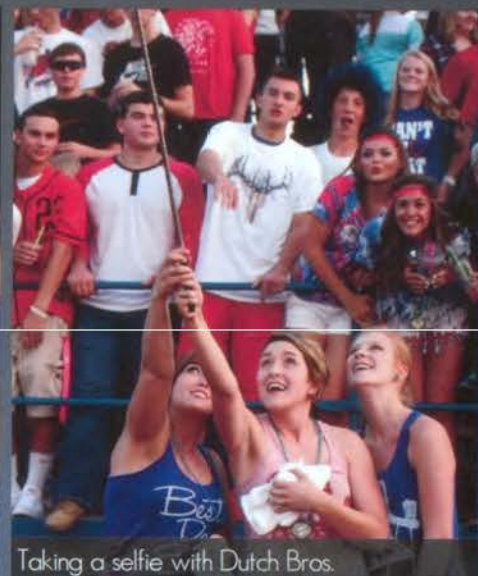

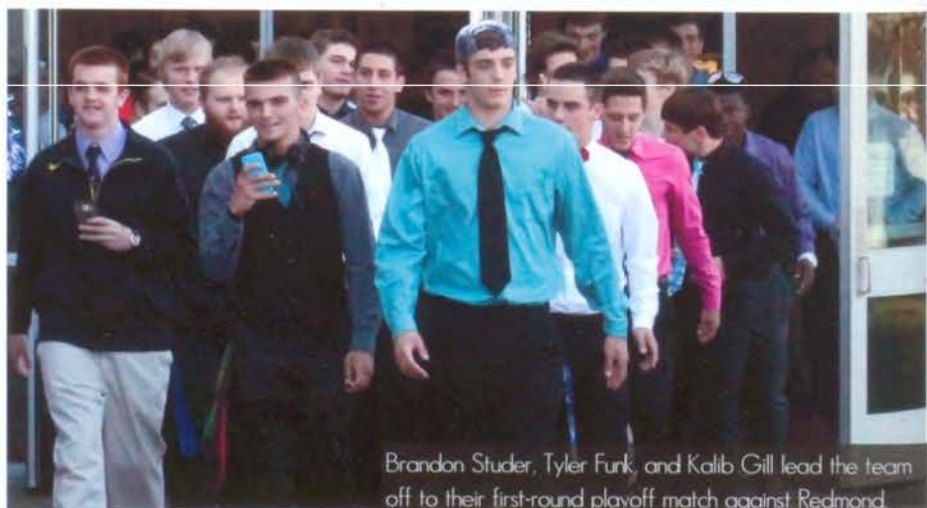
happily responded, "When Marcus Frazier talked crap and got trucked the next play."

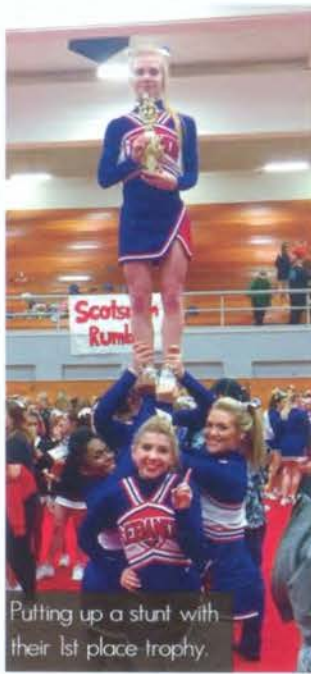

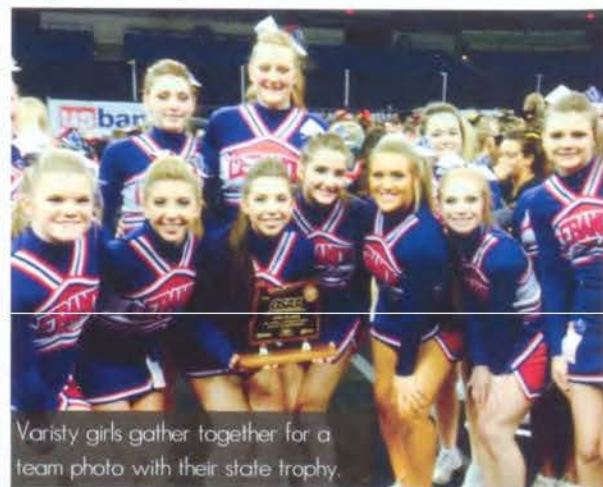
Cheer isn't all you'd expect it to be. "Cheer is a lot harder than it looks, It's hard to make it look as easy as we do," Morgan Easter explains.

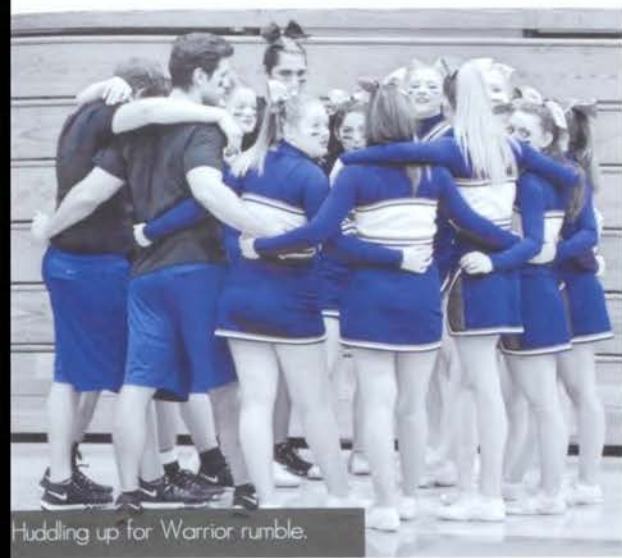

Overcoming many obstacles JV managed to place second at OCCA, Alicya said, "We rocked it! We put our everything on that mat."



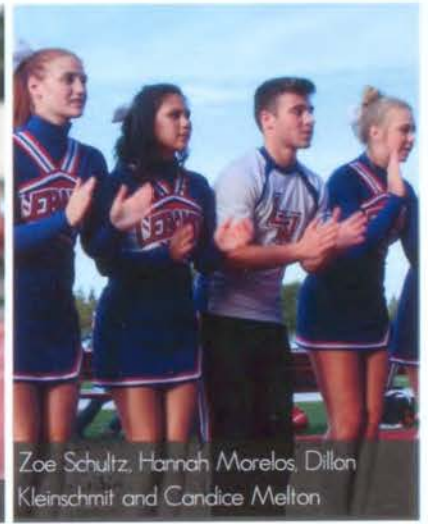

Your life awaits you. Put your phone away. Live in the present.

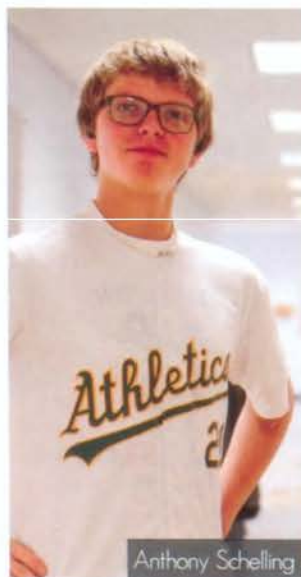
