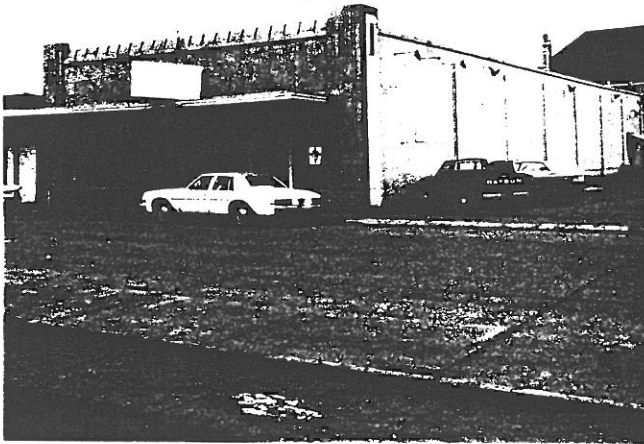

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This one-story Moderne style store has reinforced concrete walls with finished stucco and a flat roof. The front elevation has a parapet capped with tiles and a large pier at each corner. The piers step out from the building face, have a slightly larger base and feature raised vertical moldings near the tops. A flat metal awning above the large aluminum frame windows runs the length of the front elevation. The entry door at the left has been replaced with a large wooden door with brass fixtures and the sidelight and transom have been closed. Below the store windows there is a band of red tile and a smaller band of black tiles along the ground. A recent sign board with spotlights has been added above the center of the awning.

The east and west facing side elevations have six small piers that project from the wall. The east elevation is stuccoed and has spotlights installed at the parapet and a door with an awning near the rear of the building. The west and north walls are unfinished concrete. There are multi-light metal sash windows and a service door with an awning at the rear.

This building was built for a Safeway grocery store. It was remodeled in 1951, now serving as a recreation hall to the adjacent Methodist Church.
