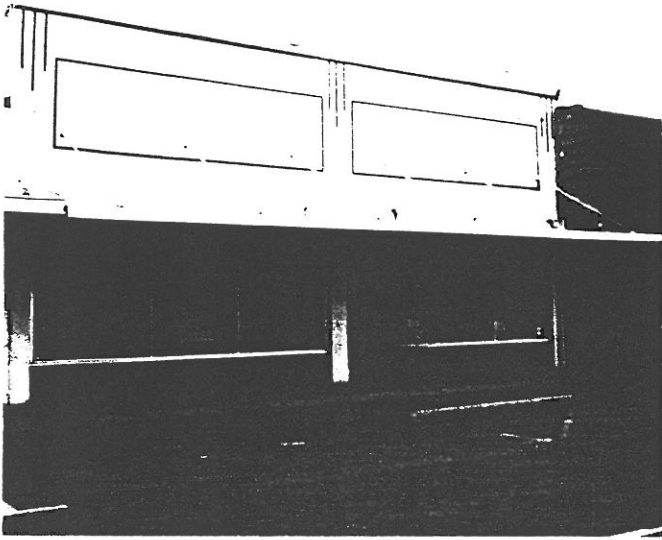

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This is a one-story modern commercial building with a rectangular floor plan. The west facade is divided into two equal bays. The north bay contains a continuous window of three large plates of glass above a low, red brick wall. The south bay is similar but has a recessed entry with an aluminum frame glass door located at the center of the building. Above the windows there is a flat awning supported by steel tie bars. The parapet is decorated with painted lines that form two panels and chevrons at the end and middle, continuing the two bays from the street level.

History

E. E. Taylor deeded this property to Bert and Berth Cotton on August 2, 1937. Fred Van Loh started a printing shop here in 1937 which developed into a stationery store also. Fred bought the building in April 1952.
