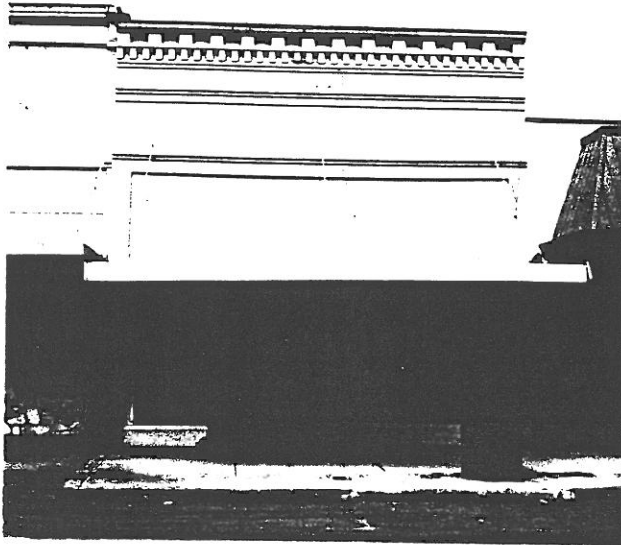

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Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This Neo-Classic masonry building is one story tall, has a rectangular floor plan and a flat roof. The entry is recessed at the south side of the east facade and features a full height single-light door with a small transom. To the north of the entry there is a large two-light display window and on the south there is a smaller single-light window, both windows set above a low glazed tile wall. Above the flat metal awning the transom windows have been closed. There is a simple, classical cornice at the parapet which features dentils and modillions.

History

At the turn of the century there was a small wood frame building housing a real estate and insurance office that specialized in timber land. This structure was replaced with the current one for a general merchandising business. Bert and Bertha Cotton occupied the building from 1915 to 1920, running their dry goods store. Later Joel Sallone ran a butcher shop here.
